Digital Housing Infrastructure for Switzerland: Wunderflats Completes DACH Region Expansion

Housing platform now active in eight European countries

Zurich/Berlin, March 18, 2026 – The European housing platform Wunderflats is expanding its infrastructure to Switzerland. By launching in key economic hubs like Zurich, Wunderflats completes its presence in the DACH region (Germany, Austria, Switzerland), bringing its total European portfolio to more than 63,000 verified apartments. This expansion addresses the growing demand for professional mobility in one of Europe's leading economic regions.

Housing as a Location Factor

The Swiss economy relies on international specialists in finance, life sciences, and technology. However, securing housing from abroad remains complex due to strict local rental requirements and administrative barriers. Wunderflats removes this friction through a standardized digital rental process that enables professionals to secure fully furnished apartments for stays of one month or longer before arriving in Switzerland. This provides companies and employees with a reliable relocation solution in one of Europe's most competitive housing markets.

Professionalization of the Private Rental Market

In addition to institutional providers, Wunderflats specifically integrates private landlords across Switzerland. The model focuses on flexibility and security, offering a structured alternative to short-term tourist rentals: landlords retain control over rental periods while benefiting from a structured tenant verification process.

"Finding housing is the primary hurdle for international professionals moving to Switzerland. With apartments ready for immediate move-in and a digital process, we eliminate bureaucratic barriers and enable a seamless start. At the same time, we provide landlords with the security they need through screened tenant profiles and legally sound contracts, enabling them to efficiently rent their properties to global talent," says **Michael Gurzan, Head of Expansion at Wunderflats**, leading the company's market entry in Switzerland.

Standardization Against Structural Barriers

Wunderflats reduces the complexity of the traditional rental market through digital standards. "Switzerland has long been a priority on our roadmap, as many of our corporate customers in the DACH region require a reliable solution for this market," explains **Jan Hase, CEO of Wunderflats**. "While the Swiss economy and its growing finance and tech sectors rely on highly specialized international talent, the housing market remains exceptionally competitive and complex for newcomers. Our goal is to provide the infrastructure that enables people to live and work anywhere in Europe through a fair process that removes bureaucratic hurdles. With our market entry in Switzerland and three other countries, we are taking a decisive step closer to this vision."



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Strategic Growth in Europe

Switzerland is a key market within Wunderflats' European growth strategy, alongside Germany, Austria, France, and Belgium. Simultaneously with the Swiss launch, the company is also launching in Spain, Portugal, and Italy. Wunderflats is now present in eight European countries. The expansion is a direct response to increasing professional mobility: according to Eurostat, 47% of all moves within Europe are work-related.

By transferring its proven digital processes to the Swiss market, Wunderflats provides both landlords and tenants in Switzerland with legal certainty through verified contracts and efficient processing. This professionalization of the rental market contributes to a more inclusive European labor market.
